According to this picture, Cold Springs looks like a growing industrial area. The large square house on the left was built by Mr. Mouseau with all the material (including the shingles) manufactured in the sawmill in the middle of the picture. The top half of the log house to the right in the picture is still standing and is used for a chicken coop. The sawmill is completely gone with its planer, and the boiler is buried on the site, close to home of Joe Clary's. The cheese factory was moved to its present location. Water for the factory and mill was provided by the spring by the trees in the middle right hand side of the picture. The tiny old shed near the middle of the picture is the shed where Miss Cora's mule decided to go instead of the road, which is County Trunk N and Shady Lane Rd. The road along the skyline is County Trunk G, with the Deo Dederich farm in the upper left hand woods. The farm on the right is the Francis Dederich farm with his folks standing out on the porch and their favorite team hitched to a wagon in the barnyard.
